
# 4 FY2023 BUDGET

DDA projects are primarily funded through tax increment financing (TIF) and Grants awarded. TIF funds are simply the increased property taxes resulting from property value growth above the 1990 base rate. In FY23, the DDA captured 96% of its income from TIF revenue. The remaining funds were earned from Interest Income.




# FY2023 **EXPENSES**

Each year, the DDA allocates funds to the projects and programs that will best accomplish district goals. The budget is then submitted to the Board of Trustees for approval. In FY23, debt and bond payments accounted for 16% of expenses, 23% for Administrative and 61% for Infrastructure Improvements.



# GRANT FUNDING AND EARMARKS

# **SS4A - SAFE STREETS FOR ALL GRANT**

The Township received a \$384,900 grant from the FHWA to create the SafeVB Roads and Streets Safety Action Plan.

The scope of the Action Plan Project will encompass the entire Township, with emphasis areas identified through detailed crash analysis and public engagement. The focus will be placed on the Belleville Road Corridor, the primary north-south artery in the Township, featuring traffic volumes reaching 35,000 vehicles per day. Solutions and countermeasures will be developed to include, but not be limited to, geometric and operational improvements, nonmotorized accommodations. access management, and enforcement strategies that result in a comprehensive plan to achieve safety objectives. Progress will be reported to the public via printed and digital means and incorporated into an on-going safety awareness program based on the recommendations within the Action Plan.

# **BELLEVILLE ROAD WIDENING PROJECT**

The State of Michigan has committed \$2.1 million toward this project through the Transportation Economic Development Fund. Congresswoman Debbie Dingell has a FY 2024 earmark of \$500,000 towards the project. The Township is continuing to seek additional grant opportunities.

# **SEMCOG PLANNING ASSISTANCE GRANT**

The Township received a \$40,000 grant from SEMCOG to create the Belleville Road Corridor Safety & Complete Streets Plan.

Under this project, Van Buren Township, will conduct a corridor safety study and supplemental complete streets planning activities along Belleville Road, the primary north-south route through Van Buren Township. The project will have three primary components:

- 1. Belleville Road Corridor and Operational and Safety Study:
- 2. Truck Route Study: An analysis of the existing truck traffic conditions will be reviewed along Belleville Road, particularly from the Costco Distribution Center and south on Belleville Road through the commercial district to I-94, and the impacts to the adjacent commercial and residential areas:
- 3. Pedestrian Traffic Study: An analysis and recommendation of the overall sidewalk connectivity within the district and the need for crosswalks along Belleville Road.

# **VAN BUREN TOWNSHIP SMALL BUSINESS GET ON** THE MAP (Master, Advance, & Prosper) PROGRAM

Senator Gary Peters has a FY 2024 earmark of \$60,000 for this program.


# **WEEKLY FOOD TRUCKS**



The Executive Director was a speaker at the Summer Workshop, she spoke on the Small Business Resource Sessions being offered by the DDA.

### **SMALL BUSINESS RESOURCE SESSIONS**

The DDA contracted with Best Practice Consulting Services to provide four Small Business Resource Sessions in September, October and November. This was the pilot program to see what the need was for the VBT small businesses, prior to launching the Get on the MAP Program. Seventeen business owners participated in the pilot.








# STREETSCAPE MAINTENANCE & LANDSCAPING
